

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Get to know São Paulo

The city is located in the southeast region of Brazil and has 11.8 million inhabitants (IBGE, 2014).

Last year, São Paulo welcomed 15.08 million visitors, and 51% of these people were in the city mainly for business purposes.

Essential to business in the entire country, São Paulo is the financial and economic capital of Brazil, not only due to its market, but also because of the large service network, the best research and study centres, and the most skilled professionals.

In addition, it has a variety of culinary options, including international cuisine, with 15,000 restaurants and 20,000 bars.

Education and communication: São Paulo has 249 technical schools, 29 universities, 7,023 elementary and basic education institutions of the Latin American Information Technology centre, the largest circulation national newspapers, 607 magazines, 42 radio stations, 11 TV stations, and 6 cable TV providers.

Industry, economy and finances: São Paulo is home to 50,800 industries, 38 of the 100 largest private national capital companies, 63% of the international groups located in Brazil, 1,900 bank branches belonging to 17 of the 20 largest banks, 40 international chambers of commerce and business, and the largest stock exchange in South America.

Services and infrastructure: The city offers more than 400 hotels with approximately 42,000 rooms available for booking, 576 travel agencies, about 86,000 rental cars, 34,000 taxis, 15,000 urban buses, the largest fleet of helicopters in the world (411), 49 airlines in operation, 2,500 health service facilities, and 45,000 military and civil policemen.

Culture, commerce, leisure, and entertainment: This bustling metropolis features 282 cinemas, 164 theatres, 39 cultural centres, 146 libraries, 53 shopping malls, 240,000 stores, 103 parks and green spaces, 11 show venues with more than 300 seats, 10 football stadiums, plus other facilities that make the city even more prepared to receive a variety of audiences.

São Paulo, an iconic city, stands out for its innovative and creative characteristics. It is also a contrasting environment, made up of "concrete jungles" with large buildings and plenty of green nature spaces – with 300,000 km² of vegetation.

Each region in this cosmopolitan city has its own unique identity.

We hope you enjoy it and feel welcome!

1.2 Anhembi Park

WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 will occupy the entire Anhembi Park, the largest exhibition centre in Latin America with a total 400,000 m², with 213,000 m² used for the Competition, including the Samsung Pavilion, Sambadrome, and Convention Palace. This will be the first time in Anhembi's history, that a single event occupies all three areas at the same time.

3.4 Accreditation

Participants will receive their accreditation badges and their Welcome Kits at their package hotels.

Wearing the accreditation badge is mandatory within Anhembi Park, as well as in all external WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 events for personal identification and access purposes to ensure access privileges, such as the types of access and days allowed, transportation, meals, etc. The legend for the symbols and information about specific areas will be detailed on the back of the accreditation badge.

Wearing the accreditation badge is also mandatory during the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, Farewell Party, and excursions.

For those participants under 18 years of age, the accreditation badge will show a symbol indicating that they are not be allowed to consume alcohol during the Farewell Party.

For Competitors and Team Leaders, the badge itself will not allow access to external events except for Opening Ceremony, Closing Ceremony, and Farewell party. For all the others external events a ticket or invitation must be presented at the entrance.

3.5 Catering

WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 has put a lot of effort into preparing high quality catering services to ensure that all participants have access to a variety of food options and that - as much as possible - their individual and cultural eating habits and needs are met. Participants should really enjoy their meals.

Important notice

For packages, all included meals and drinks begin the day after arrival and end at breakfast the last day of the package. The only exception is for Competitors and Team Leaders, who will receive a welcome snack together with their accreditation badge upon arrival at the hotels.

Breakfast

Breakfast is included in all participant packages and will be served at the hotels.

Drinks and snacks

Drinks and snacks will be served daily to Official Observers, Observers, Experts, Official Delegates, Team Leaders, Technical Delegates, and Technical Delegate Assistants at their work/meeting rooms.

Drinks and snacks will include: coffee, tea, water, various snacks, and fruits.



Delegate restaurants

There are two Delegate restaurants at Anhembi Park - one in the Sambadrome (Samba Restaurant) and one next to the Holiday Inn (Brasil Restaurant).

A specific restaurant will be designated for each Competitor and Expert depending on the location of their skill competition.

The "Samba Restaurant" will be open from 8-15 August (C-4 to C4) from 11:00-14:00, and the "Brasil Restaurant" will be open from 6-15 August (C-6 to C+1) from 11:00-14:00.

Menu will change daily and be displayed on the menu boards inside the restaurant. Lunch and dinner menus will always include: beef, fish, and poultry.

3.6 Information technology - support and services

Mobile phones

The Competition Organizer da WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 will provide mobile phones for Official Delegates, Technical Delegates, Chief Experts, Deputy Chief Experts, Workshop Managers, Team Leaders (maximum of 2 per Member), and WorldSkills International. You can pick up your mobile phone at the Radio and Telephone Centre in the Samsung Pavilion.

Please note

Mobile phones must be returned to the Radio and Telephone Centre before departure, or on 16 August, whichever comes first. If a mobile phone is not returned, the cost will be charged to the respective Member by the WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 Competition Organizer.

Your phone will initially receive 60 minutes for local, national, and international calls; free intragroup calls inside the city of São Paulo; unlimited national SMS service and 3G Internet (1 GB). You can recharge credit using your international credit card: BRL 65.00 for 60 more minutes; BRL 59.00 for a 3G Internet recharge, limited to 1 GB. There will be helpdesk services available in Portuguese and English 08:00-20:00 at the Radio and Telephone Centre 8-16 August (C-4 to C+1).

Internet access

There will be wireless Internet available at the venue, especially at Wi-Fi zones like Cyber, the Food Court at the Samsung Pavilion, and at the Food Court in the Sambadrome.

3.7 Volunteers

WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 volunteers will provide necessary support in areas where Competitors and visitors will be present. They will also be at the airport to receive all of the Competitors helping to answer any questions.

In addition, an Attaché will be assigned to each delegation to support the Team Leader and Competitors during their stay in São Paulo. You will meet your Attaché personally upon arrival at the airport. The Attaché will help you get your accreditation badges, and will assist you with your check-in at the hotel.

In addition, the Attaché will accompany your team during the excursions and help them at the Opening and Closing Ceremonies. The Attaché will have a cell phone, and will be available to answer your questions and requests.

This phone number will be provided to you by your Attaché when you arrive. All volunteers will do their best to contribute to the success of WorldSkills São Paulo 2015!

3.8 Press Centre

The Press Centre is located at the Convention Palace, on the access road to the Sambadrome. This is the work area designated for representatives of the press who are covering the event. Capacity: maximum of 200 people at any one time. Open 10-17 August according to the following schedule:

11 August 2015: 08:00-02:00 (12 August)

12 August 2015: 08:00-20:00 13 August 2015: 08:00-20:00 14 August 2015: 08:00-20:00 15 August 2015: 08:00-20:00

To keep press up-to-date about the Competition, we are planning on having a daily media briefing session every morning for 30 minutes at Press Briefing Room (check the schedule on the Official Media Website: http://media.worldskills.org) where press a can get the latest Competition schedule information, and ask questions.

In addition, we will have screens in the Press Centre providing regular news and updates about WorldSkills São Paulo 2015. Access to the Press Centre requires press accreditation.

3.9 Safety and emergency procedures

Purpose

The purpose of these procedures is to ensure, as much as possible, the safety, health, and well-being of the participants, workers, students, and visitors during WorldSkills São Paulo 2015.

In order to comply with the relevant Brazilian legislation, the WorldSkills Health, Safety, and Environmental policy and guidelines were prepared and distributed, and all of the spaces have emergency alert systems installed. An Emergency Control Team is organized and trained to help out with possible occurrences.

Emergency control team

The Emergency Control Team consists of Workshop Managers, Civil Fire Department, Emergency Brigade, Security, Security Guards Coordinator, Medical Coordinator of the Health Service, Occupational Safety Coordinator, as well as external agents, such as emergency and fire services.

The Emergency Control Team's role is to ensure the safety of all who attend WorldSkills São Paulo 2015, and quick services for any kinds of emergencies that may occur. During emergency situations, this team will provide the necessary instructions, with approval from the Health, Safety, and Environment teams.

We would like to also ask all participants to become familiar with the emergency alarms available, glass break alarms, evacuation plans, emergency exits, assembly points, as well as the Workshop Mangers, Fire Department, and Emergency Brigade workers present in your area and space.

Security

Access and circulation areas in different event spaces will be monitored through internal circuit monitoring. The recorded images are confidential and will be stored for future procedures.



Medical service

In order to assist all of the WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 participants, we will have seven advanced medical assistance points in the venue, distributed in strategic positions as shown in the specific map in this handbook.

There will always be ambulances for quick assistance, with mobile intensive care units and four basic support units, during the Competition's official operating hours at the Competition venue, as well as in the hotels in which participants on packages are staying.

In addition to the ambulances, we will have a large team of civil firefighterrescuers, trained to provide first aid and rescue services. These firefighters will be positioned in strategic locations, according to the event risk maps.

If a Competitor or Expert uses regular medication or requires regular medical supervision (e.g. self-applied injection with adrenaline, insulin, continuous use heart medication), the Chief Expert and Workshop Manager must be notified before preparation and familiarization begins.

Details about these medical conditions must be documented using the Anaphylaxis Action Plan form or Asthma Action Plan provided to the Technical Delegates. The Anaphylaxis Action Plan should be displayed on the wall of the Workshop Manager's office.



Emergency evacuation plan and escape routes

At all times during an emergency, please follow the instructions provided by the Workshop Managers.

- At any times, an evacuation order may be communicated, through an alarm or verbally, "You must evacuate immediately!";
- Whether you hear an evacuation alarm or verbal instructions from a Workshop Manager, abandon the venue through the nearest and safest escape route, which will take you to a specific assembly point. All doors must be closed - but not locked - when leaving. Once outside the building, keep streets and access free for the Fire Department and health assistance services;
- Help anyone with special needs to leave the venue, or take them to either a place that is isolated from the risk or the closest safe assembly point;
- Keep calm! Walk, do not run, and go to the nearest emergency assembly point and follow the Safety and Environment Team instructions (Fire Department and Brigade);
- Stay in groups at the assembly point until you receive instructions from a Workshop Manager or emergency service personnel indicating it is alright to return to the venue or leave the venue. Do not enter an area when the emergency alarm is ringing.

Fire and smoke

If you see or smell either fire or smoke, activate the alarm!

- 1. If it is safe to do so, ensure the immediate safety of anyone within the immediate fire area;
- 2. Activate the fire alarm if it still hasn't been switched on by using the manual alarm activation or yell "FIRE! FIRE! FIRE!", if there isn't an alarm near;
- 3. Evacuate the area immediately;
- 4. Do not return to the venue before the Workshop Manager or Health, Safety and Environment team (Fire Department/Brigade and Doctor) say it is safe to do so.

Emergency measures

The Competition Organizer guarantees that there are emergency plans and measures in place throughout the entire Competition venue. During the event, our emergency control team will take on the necessary safety precautions in the following situations:

- 1. Organize a rescue chain for cases where there are injuries or accidents;
- 2. Chemical/spill/gas leak contamination;
- 3. Alarm and Emergency Plan.

Personal injury

- 1. Please contact the Workshop Manager or closest Emergency Control Team;
- 2. Send the injured party to the Medical Centre, if necessary
- 3. Become acquainted with the location of the first aid kit and Civil Fire Department/Brigade in your area;
- 4. If you are robbed: notify the Workshop Manager or nearest Security Guard and provide details about the occurrence;

Responsibilities for persons with special needs

- 1. Whether your disability is temporary or permanent, whenever possible it is important for you to know your own needs and follow the necessary instructions for emergency situations or evacuation plans.
- 2. Please know that you can ask for help and should clearly communicate your needs.
- 3. Become acquainted with the exit routes, and check to see if these are appropriate for your needs, even if they are not part of your circulation route;

4. Remember, you are encouraged to specify what kind of assistance you may require from others during an emergency. Do not assume that people around you will know what to do.

Assistance for persons with physical disabilities

- 1. Do not provide physical guidance, hold, lift, or carry a conscious person without their permission. This includes refraining from pushing someone in a wheelchair, or "rushing" them forward without their permission.
- 2. Ask what kind of help the person needs. For example, see if you should clear the path ahead, or walk beside or behind them. Try to avoid providing advice or guessing what the person needs if you don't know them.

3.10 Sustainability at WorldSkills São Paulo 2015

Our sustainability commitment with each WorldSkills Competition constantly grows. We have developed some actions for WorldSkills São Paulo 2015 that help promote an environmentally responsible, socially just, and economically feasible event.

Some of the main actions include: solid waste management, recyclable materials sent to cooperative trash collection centres and waste separated and processed on site.

We would also like to highlight the neutralization process for greenhouse gases through carbon credits or certified emission reductions, reducing the environmental impacts generated by the Competition.

The event will comply with ABNT ISO 20121 guidelines - Management Systems for Sustainable Events. Interactive educational actions were also planned, including energy generation through electrical flooring and available bicycles, recycling demonstrations and sustainable building processes, among others.

In the skill workshops, an expert will monitor and ensure proper waste disposal during the competitions and provide other sustainability guidelines. In other Anhembi Park areas, there will also be selective waste collection, with two different types of bins: recyclable (paper, plastic, tetrapak packages, among others) and non-recyclables (napkins, Styrofoam, food scraps, aluminum foil).



Luggage

Currency exchange

The international airport in São Paulo (GRU) has several currency exchange bureaus open 24 hours.

Safety for Arrival and Departure at Airports:

- Always keep your belongings and important documents in hand.
- Only ask Police Officers or identified employees for information or assistance.
- If you need to exchange foreign currency, search for an accredited currency exchange bureau.
- Preferably, only use official and authorized taxis at the airports, and place your luggage in the trunk yourself.
- Pay close attention when using ATMs, and do not accept help from people you do not know.
- Keep your passport in the safe deposit box at the hotel, but always carry a document with a photo when going around the city.
